

Statistics:

A proper background in inferential statistics, including 2-way ANOVA, is essential. A review of statistics should **precede** the first study and is the responsibility of each student. Psychology 2100 or the equivalent is a prerequisite for this course. Students who have received a grade lower than C- in statistics may not register for Research Methods until the statistics course is repeated and a grade of C- or higher is earned.



We will *tentatively* progress through the material of the course in the order of the chapters in the textbook, spending much more time and going into much more detail on some aspects of the material than on others.
