

## Notice to Employee

**Do you have to file?** Refer to the instructions for Forms 1040 and 1040-R to determine if you're required to file a return. Even if you don't have to file a return, you may be eligible for a refund if box 2 shows a refund or if you're eligible for any credits.

**Earned income credit (EIC).** You may be able to take the EIC for 2020 if your adjusted gross income (AGI) is less than the amount of the credit based on income and family size. Workers with children could qualify for smaller credits. You and any qualifying children must have valid Social Security numbers (SSNs). You can take the EIC if your income is more than the specified amount for 2020 or if income is earned for services provided while you were an immigrant or nonresident alien. For 2020 income limits and more information, visit [www.irs.gov/EITC](http://www.irs.gov/EITC). See Pub. 596, Earned Income Credit. **Any EIC that is more than your tax liability is refundable to you, but only if you file a tax return.**

**Lergy and religious workers.** If you aren't subject to Social Security and Medicare taxes, see Pub. 51, Occupational Safety and Health Information for Members of the Clergy and Religious Workers.

**Corrections.** If your name, SSN, or address is incorrect, correct copies, C, and D and ask your employer to correct your employment record. Make sure to ask the employer to file Form

W-2c, Corrected Wage and Tax Statement, with the Social Security Administration (SSA) to correct any name, SSN, or money amounts reported on the W-2. Make sure to get your copies of Form W-2c from your employer for all corrections made so you may file them with your tax return. If your name and Social Security number are shown on your Social Security card, you should ask for a new card that displays your corrected name and Social Security office or by calling 1-800-772-1213.
